Cashmere has three major festivals. The Wenatchee River Bluegrass Festival is in mid-June. Founders' Days occurs the last weekend in June. Apple Days falls on the first full weekend in October. In addition, Cashmere is home to the Chelan County Fair, which is the week following Labor Day. Take it more of our sights and sounds at various annual events held at the Chelan County Expo Center too.

Cashmere has a charming downtown, lined with a popular bakery, barber shops, a hardware store and a genuine old-fashioned soda fountain at the local pharmacy. Relax at the City pool or tour our museum, candy factory, tasting rooms and 9/11 memorial all in walking distance of downtown. While you sightsee be on the lookout for the Gnomes of Cashmere, various businesses have hidden doors for your entertainment. In addition, there are three antique malls and several great restaurants. Cashmere Valley Bank is also located right downtown, and Wenatchee Valley Clinic has a branch in Cashmere just a few blocks from downtown. Martin's IGA Market Fresh is a full-service grocery store located out on Titchenal Way, and is accessible by public bus, which makes a loop route through Cashmere on its way to Leavenworth or Wenatchee.

Cashmere is located in the geographical center of the state, with Wenatchee 10 miles to the east and Leavenworth about 15 miles to the west. Cashmere is conveniently located off Highway 2/97 in the heart of Washington's Playground. We look forward to your visit to Cashmere!




